Our Spotlight this month features Sarah Tracy, Second Grade Teacher

Can you share a bit of background about yourself?

I live in Pittsfield with my husband Josh and our two-year-old daughter Lilly. We have two cats, Tony and Brooke and just added a puppy to our family this past summer. Her name is June and she is a golden doodle.

What was your job before coming to Farmington River?

Before working at Farmington I was a full-time nanny for a family in Lenox. In high school, I waitressed at a diner while also babysitting as much as I could. I knew that I would be best suited in a job that is focused on children.

What are your hobbies, or what do you enjoy doing on your time off?

I enjoy reading, shopping, and spending time with my family during my off time. We often make small trips over the weekends to do fun things with our daughter. We also frequently visit the dog park so our new puppy can visit with some of her friends too!

What is your job at Farmington River and what does it entail?

I am the second grade teacher so I am responsible for teaching all my students math, ELA (English Language Arts), writing, science, and social studies. In my class we focus on classroom community and respecting one another and the space we are in. We have a morning meeting every day, take a movement/mediation

break in the morning, and generally check in with each other to make sure everyone is where they need to be to do their best work.

I am very fortunate to be working at Farmington River. It is such a unique school in the sense that everyone knows everyone and the teachers have an opportunity to give students the one-on-one attention they need. My goal as a teacher is to make every student feel heard and understood. I want to give them a supportive environment to grow in, both academically and socially.

What's your favorite part of the day?

My favorite part of the day is our morning meeting. We do the same routine every day and it is a great way to get everyone together before heading off to do work. It starts with a greeting, then we read a message that gives the students an overview of the day lastly we do a quick team building activity. Students can also ask questions about upcoming events or the schedule, they can share something that is exciting or new that is happening at home. It is just a nice time to come together and all get on the same page.

What sort of message do you want to give to children and parents?

I would want the students and parents to know that we are here to help their child however we can. We are all on the same team and we want to work with you to get your child to meet their goals.


CONSERVATION PROJECT
