




KINDERGARTEN WRITING

LITERACY CENTERS IN GRADE 1

First grade students work on improving their reading and writing skills through a variety of different activities each day. Our ELA block starts out with drilling all of our sounds and trick words. The line leader leads this daily activity. After our phonics lesson, students practice the daily phonics skill(s) through the use of magnet boards or white boards. Students enjoy using popits to help them sound out their words. First graders then move into literacy centers. This consists of 2, 20 minute centers that they rotate through each day. Centers include Guided Reading with Mrs. Martin, Poetry Center or Scholastic News with Mrs. Olds, and a variety of independent centers that include the listening center, work on writing, word work, or independent work. On Fridays we rotate through a variety of literacy games. Below is a collage of first graders at work during their literacy block.


<u>PHILOSOPHY:</u>


