FRES Respiratory Illness Procedure Snapshot

Staff or Students who have new, significant, symptoms of respiratory illness such as cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, not explained by other causes: Allergies, lingering cough, etc., should stay home. Additionally, stay home when any of the following are

- Fever above 100 ° F
- Student who is unable to easily manage secretions (body fluids) due to coughing or runny nose/eyes (able to manage when able to wear mask and/or cover coughs and sneezes using a tissue or inner elbow, not their hands)
- Student does not feel well enough to participate fully in classroom activities/play.
- Student is having a hard time staying awake due to not feeling well.
- Student is not eating due to illness
- · Student has tested positive for respiratory illness and have any of the above symptoms, consider staying home for 48-72 hours to help stop the spread of illness. If you have questions about how long to stay out, please contact the health office.

When you start to feel better: You may begin to resume normal activities/school with precautions if: 1. You have not had a fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications; AND 2. Your other symptoms are improving.

For at least 5 days after you resume normal activities, take these extra precautions: 1. Wear a mask anytime you are indoors around other people. 2. Practice good hand hygiene. If your symptoms get worse again: If fever comes back or any other symptoms start to get worse, you should go back home until you are feeling better again and refer back to "When you start to feel better" section above.

If you have tested positive for a respiratory illness but do not have any symptoms please refer to the complete procedure located in the wellness section of our website.
