#### **Dear Farmington River Elementary Families,**

Happy Mid-March! Today, students brought home their standards-based report cards, which provide a detailed look at their progress in meeting grade-level expectations. Our report cards use a 1-5 scale, with 1 indicating the student is making minimal progress toward the grade level standard and 5 representing the student is consistently and independently exceeding the grade level standard. This system focuses on growth and achievement rather than traditional letter grades. When reviewing your child's report card, look for areas of strength and opportunities for improvement, and use it as a guide for setting goals. If you have any questions, please reach out to your child's teacher.

We are excited to share that on Tuesday, March 18, our students will enjoy a special marionette performance of The Dragon King, presented by the Tanglewood Marionettes from Ware, MA. This incredible assembly is made possible by the generosity of our PTA and the many families who tirelessly fundraise to support enrichment opportunities for our students. Reading Buddies is a fun and effective way to promote literacy, confidence, and peer relationships. It's a win-win for both the younger and older students and they look forward to it each week!










## 5TH GRADERS MASTER THE STATES OF MAT

Our 5th-grade scientists have been hard at work exploring the fascinating world of matter! Over the past few weeks, students have been investigating the three main states of matter—solids, liquids, and gases—and how they interact and change through processes like melting, freezing, condensation, and evaporation. Through engaging lessons, discussions, and observations, they explored the properties of different materials and how matter behaves in the world around them.

Throughout the unit, students learned how temperature and pressure affect matter and how these changes occur in everyday life. They explored examples such as water turning into steam, ice melting into liquid, and even the effects of condensation on a cold surface. The unit challenged them to think critically about the science behind these changes and how they apply to real-world situations.

To wrap up the unit in a fun and engaging way, students participated in a variety of "States of Matter" games designed to test their knowledge. They played interactive games where they had to quickly identify different states of matter and their properties. In another activity, students could manipulate the movement of molecules—moving them closer together as a solid, flowing around as a liquid, and spreading out as a gas. These games not only reinforced what they had learned but also encouraged teamwork and critical thinking.

The enthusiasm and curiosity shown by our 5th graders throughout this unit have been truly inspiring! They have gained a deeper understanding of the world around them and are now able to recognize and explain how matter is constantly changing. We are so proud of their hard work and can't wait to see what they discover next in science! Keep up the great work, young scientists!

#### **SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER:**

#### THE 2025-2026 BUDGET AND REVISIONS TO THE REGIONAL DISTRICT AGREEMENT

The FRRSD school committee, our school business manager and I have spent the last few months carefully estimating costs and revenues to create a sound financial plan for next year. This year's budget process has been somewhat more complex because the Regional District Agreement (RDA) is in the final stages of revision and two potential assessment scenarios needed to be prepared for our budget planning.

As many are aware, the school committee and other community members took on the work of updating the Regional Agreement about two years ago. This work was intended to update the 30-year old document. The revision was also a response to concerns related to financial sustainability expressed by the town of Sandisfield. The school committee completed its revisions in September of 2024 and in January of 2025 the document cleared the content and legal reviews required by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

The assessment impacts of the proposed RDA amendments would shift the cost split from about 60% Otis / 40% Sandisfield to about 66% Otis / 34% Sandisfield for the 2025-2026 school year (FY26). The amended RDA was approved by Sandisfield voters in a special town meeting of February 28. Otis residents will have the opportunity to vote on the amended RDA in a special town meeting on March 25.

Last week on Monday, community members from both towns attended a RDA public information session where FY26 budget impacts were reviewed in detail. On Monday, March 31 at 6:00 pm, there will be a public hearing of the 2025-2026 budget following the outcome of the Otis in the library of FRES. All are invited to attend.
