Dear Farmington River Elementary Families,

As April comes to a close and the signs of spring are finally settling in, we are looking forward to the exciting learning opportunities and community events that await us in May. One initiative we are especially proud to participate in, alongside our amazing PTA, is Screen-Free Week, a nationwide movement that encourages families to pause from recreational screen use and rediscover the joy of offline activities, creativity, and connection. To support this effort, the PTA has planned a whole week of fun and engaging events designed to promote student participation and encourage time away from screens through physical movement, play, creativity, and meaningful interaction with family and the world around them. Keep an eye out for the schedule of events coming home soon!

During Screen-Free Week, our computer classes will shift their focus to the timely topic of internet safety and responsible technology use, with lessons aligned to the Massachusetts Digital Literacy and Computer Science (DLCS) standards. Across all grade levels, students will learn how to stay safe online, protect their personal information, and use technology responsibly. K-2 students will explore asking for help from trusted adults, keeping personal information private, and finding balance with screen time. Grades 3-5 will focus on safe browsing, evaluating websites for credibility, and digital citizenship. Grade 6 students will take a deeper dive into understanding digital footprints, online ethics, and responsible use in academic and social spaces.

We encourage families to take part in these conversations at home as well. Knowing what your child is accessing online is more important than ever. Setting parental controls and having open, ongoing discussions about online behavior can go a long way in ensuring safe and healthy digital habits. Just before spring break, many of our upper-grade students had the opportunity to attend Nature's Classroom, where they spent three days fully unplugged, with no phones or screens, just the outdoors and each other. It was remarkable to witness the shift in how they interacted, shared stories, built friendships, and engaged deeply with the natural world. The experience reminded us all of the value of slowing down and being present. It's something we hope they'll carry with them into Screen-Free Week and beyond.

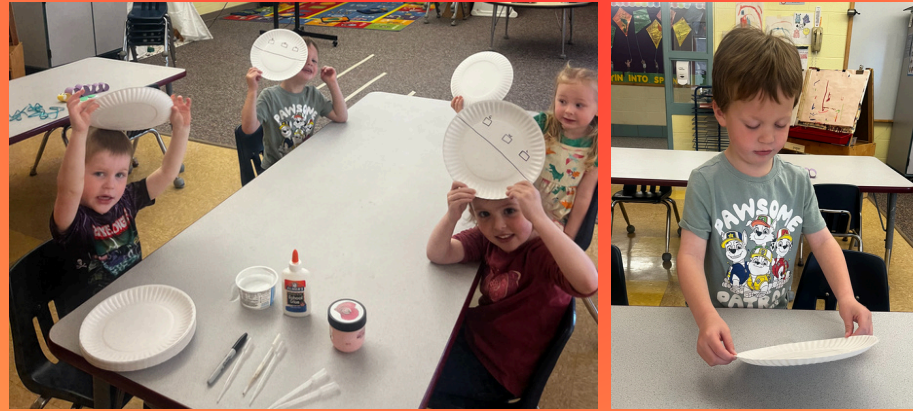

PRESCHOOL'S HANDS-ON SCIENCE

In preschool, we've been exploring different ways people travel! This week, our focus is on traveling by water. To help students understand how movement through water is possible, we conducted a fun science experiment called a "liquid race." We tested three different liquids —glue, water, and lotion — by adding droplets of water to each and tilting the plates to see which liquid moved the fastest. Through this hands-on activity, students were introduced to the concept of viscosity and explored how some liquids allow for easier movement than others.

SCHOOL ADJUSTMENT COUNSELOR'S CORNER

All of our students at FRES are learning a thoughtful and respectful way to handle conflicts using a tool called the **Peace Path**. This gentle process helps children talk through problems by focusing on their own feelings rather than blaming others.

The Peace Path gives both students involved in a conflict a chance to be heard, to share how they feel, and to listen to one another. Together, they work toward finding a solution that feels fair and respectful to everyone. It's a caring way to build understanding and practice empathy.

With guidance from teachers and staff, students are learning how to use calm words—like "I feel ... when..."—and take turns speaking and listening. Whether it's on the playground or in the classroom, kids are becoming more confident in resolving problems peacefully.

The students are really learning to care for one another and helping to build a kind, supportive school community—one peaceful step at a time.



MEANWHILE IN THE GYM...

Students in P.E. classes are learning about striking with long handled implements. 3rd-6th grade has been learning about the rules of pickleball while successfully playing mini games during class! Ask your student about Pickleball 4-square.



Students in K-2nd grade are learning about striking with a long handled implement.
